Researched Emergency Alert Systems, met with Town of Washington and representative from Civic Ready regarding alert programs.

Presented proposal to Selectboard to purchase EAS system from DialMyCalls using ARP monies for \$250.00 for 5,000 calls for an unlimited time period.

Corresponded with Little Learner Daycare regarding Covid cases and closing of their facility.

Placed Keag/Library Warming Shelter on standby status to open twice for storms and Spruce Head Community Church Warming Shelter on standby status for opening after blizzard.

Monitored snowstorms and blizzards Jan 7-8, Jan 15-16, Jan 28-29.

Pickup and delivered N95 masks from County EMA for both Shelters, Town Office Personnel, Library patrons and personnel.

Obtained/ delivered fuel for Keag/library Warming Shelter generator.

Completed monthly AED inspections at both Library and Spruce Head Community Church Shelters and performed monthly maintenance on the emergency generator at the Library/ Keag Shelter.
